








## My Name is Aku

Before I go out, she always asks me a lot of questions...




"Where are you going?

The wind is blowing hard, too.




"Don't worry," says Mrs. B.

Mrs. B explains:

"I have Notify NYC.

With *Notify NYC*, I can get text messages about emergencies."



"And, we have a computer.

We can use Facebook to get information."



"But don't worry.

Your parents have good friends and neighbors, like Mrs. Chen.

Mrs. Chen will check on everyone in your building.

Your parents will be safe."



Finally, I reach my mother on the phone.

My mother asks:

"Where are you? Are you okay?"



### I explain:

"Mom, thanks to Mrs. B, I'm safe.

And I know more about emergencies, too."



When I get home, my mom and dad are very happy to see me.

It's still very wet outside, so we have a picnic on the floor!



It's good to be together.

And it's good to have a plan for a picnic...

Or for a storm!
