My Name is Irina

Before, I lived with my dog. My dog was my companion. My dog's name was Bobik. Bobik passed away last year.



Now, I live alone. I am an independent woman. I like my independence.



Recently, I had an operation. I was in the hospital for a short time. Now, I have help at home. I have two home health aides, Umme and Silvia. Umme helps me at night. Silvia helps me in the daytime.



My health is getting better. But there is a problem. I got a letter from my landlord. My landlord is raising my rent.



I can't afford a big rent increase.

I am worried.

I don't want to be homeless.

Umme and Silvia want to help me.



"What about talking to someone at the senior center?" Umme suggests.

It's a good idea.

There are helpful people at the senior center.



One day, Silvia visits a senior center. She meets with the coordinator of the center. Silvia asks about my housing problem. The coordinator says they can help me.



Today, I am happy because I am healthy again.

I am not homebound.

I can be independent again.



But, I am also a little sad. I have to say goodbye to Silvia. Silvia and Umme are my heroes.



Umme called 311 for me. They told her about a *rent freeze*. It's not a cold apartment. It's a City program. A rent freeze stops the rent from going up.



A rent freeze is for seniors in rent-regulated apartments.

It's also for people with disabilities in rent-regulated apartments.

I am going to find out the details.



At the senior center, I meet with Ana.

She is a social worker.

She tells me about tenant rights.

Tenants are people who rent apartments.

Tenants have rights.



For example, tenants have the right to heat.

The apartment must be *at least* 62 degrees farenheit.

That's about 16 degrees celcius.

That's warm in Russia!



Tenants have the right to hot water too.


Ana gives me a guidebook about tenant rights in my language.

This is my new friend, Luis. We met at the senior center. We both like dogs.

He said, "I didn't want to go to a senior center." He said, "I don't feel old." But, now he says, "I like the senior center." I understand him.



I like Luis. I invite him for dinner. We eat *vareniki*. It's a Russian dish.



Luis likes me too.

He lives with his daughter and her family.

Luis invites me to meet them.

He invites me to meet his dog, Boby, too!



I go to Luis's home for dinner. I can't believe my eyes... Silvia is there! Silvia is Luis's daughter. Luis is her father!



I meet the whole family:

Luis's son-in-law, Rolando, and his grandson, Lionel.

And Boby, his dog.



We have a beautiful dinner together. I tell them the good news... I don't need to leave my apartment. And, I am applying for a rent freeze.
