I heard about the Niño Contento Pre-K. It's close to where we live. There are a lot of Spanish-speaking families who have children at the school.




Let's see if there's space there.






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### At the Sunrise Pre-K

Lian has an interview with the director of the Pre-K that Ms. Lin recommended.










## **Martin Makes a Decision**

Isabel's father, Martin, is going to show you some Mexican culture.






One toy is a cup that catches a ball. It's called a "balero."


